Tech talk:

Terry thanked Ernie for giving him some cedar wood that Ernie had extra from canoe building. Terry will use this for making the body of a vintage single-person racing car. To further show his appreciation for the cedar, Terry has brought to the club some miscellaneous pieces of wood (oak, walnut, grape, etc) for free to whoever is interested. Terry also brought a length of plastic sheathing that can be cut to length to use to cover your knife blade when the knife is stored. There are also some hacksaw blade saws that Terry has fashioned; note that some cut on the pull as opposed to the push, and that these style saws are useful when cutting into a hole.
